




Foreword



The occasion upon which the United States Ship Antietam "Crossed the Line" was a memorable one for the entire ship's company. Prior to that day there was a preponderance of the uninitiated on board; over fifteen hundred men, some with many years service, had never been welcomed into that fraternity of the sea—the "Ancient Order of the Deep."

The ceremony was an impressive one and complied in all respects with those traditions of the sea which have grown up over a long period of time and which have now become more or

less standardized.

The origin of the ancient and time-honored ceremony of crossing the line," occasionally called the Equator, is somewhat ob-

scure. When origins are obscure all of us will guess.

According to legend the ancient mariners were very superstitious folk and upon the occasion of crossing the equator for the first time on a voyage they held certain rituals to perpetuate the god of the sea and to insure a safe passage. In the early days of sail, a voyage around the Horn was a hazardous undertaking, the roaring forties and "Cape Stiff" were enough to try any ship's stamina and any man's soul. Thus when a vessel from northerly latitudes set forth upon such an adventure, it became the custom to hold an initiation ceremony upon crossing the line to determine if the youngsters or novices were strong enough to withstand the rigors and hardships of the grueling journey around the Horn. Undoubtedly these early ceremonies were boisterous indeed and when a man had come through them successfully he was a real sailorman.

Today the preliminaries and the build-up lack nothing by way of instilling awe and respect for the ruler of the deep and when the ordeal is over a man knows that he has earned the title of "Shellback."

This souvenir book has been prepared with the object of providing our relatives and friends with a description of this happy event and of preserving for future reference a narrative and word picture of the procedure, ritual, and costumes which are indispensable to a proper introduction to King Neptune, "Ruler of the Raging Main."



Prologue

At 0800 on 1 May 1947, the U.S.S. Antietam in the company of the U.S.S. Shangri-La and other vessels of Task Force 38 stood out from Pearl Harbor for Sydney, Australia. After the ship was underway for about one day a meeting of all Shellbacks was called. The steering committee was elected, as well as various subcommittees to arrange for, and prepare the ship and its load of Pollywogs for a crossing of the line ceremony. The committees held meetings every day in different parts of the ship in order that the Pollywogs would not discover what horrible fate was being prepared for them. There were minor uprisings during this time, but they were easily subdued by the Shellbacks by removing the ring-leader before their plans could be put in full operation. Like most Pollywogs of past history they were never able to get fully organized. The Shellbacks were outnumbered considerably, the count being 1600 Pollywogs to about 350 Shellbacks. On the 4th of May a message was received from His Majesty via the Task Force Commander, in which His Majesty directed that positive action be taken to subdue disrespectful conduct and words on the part of the Pollywogs and further directed that all Pollywogs prepare to meet Neptunus Rex himself.

At 1300 on the 5th of May a special watch was set up to keep a lookout for His Majesty's Scribe, Davey Jones, who it was felt might make an appearance that day. All Pollywogs were ordered into the Pollywog uniform of the day. The members of the Special Equator Watch were in their prescribed uniforms. At 1600 a dispatch was received from the Task Force Commander stating that an unidentified object had been sighted ahead, and that all ships should take necessary action. This turned out to be Davey Jones and His Party. They arrived by seahorse chariot. He was met at the Weather Hawse Pipe by the Executive Officer who brought them up to the bridge, where he was met and welcomed aboard by the Captain. In His Party was the Royal Chaplain, who gave out sympathy chits to those whom he thought most deserving, The Royal Scribe, The Royal Chief Justice, The Royal High Sheriff, and The Royal Prosecutor. After his meeting with the Captain, at which time he gave the Captain a subpoena to be served to each and every Pollywog aboard, Davey Jones and His Party inspected the Pollywogs on the flight deck. The deck. The Royal Kops had to convince some special cases, and then with lesser offenders.

of the Pollywogs that it was the wisest thing to remain in that position. The Royal Prosecutor was heard to remark that he had never seen such a collection of plow jockeys and lubberly scum on one ship before. Davey Jones was heard to make similar remarks, on his departure from the ship he assured the Executive Officer that all would be found guilty before being tried and that His Majesty would be very harsh in his punishment of these intruders into his domain.

The following day, the 6th of May, the subpoenas were served on all Pollywogs by the Shellbacks. There were many strange noises heard as the Pollywogs read the charges against them. The rest of the day was spent in the final preparation for the arrival of His Majesty scheduled for the next day. The night was for the most part quiet, but there were a few Pollywogs on the prowl. Some of them were calling the Royal Shellbacks on the room phones while others attempted to wreck the tank and the tunnel of love that was built on the deck edge elevator. All of their efforts were in vain.

Bright and early the following morning the Shellbacks mustered on the flight deck. All equipment was checked for final readiness. At 0815 all hands were called to quarters on the flight deck. Shellback Kops took charge of the different divisions and marched the Pollywogs into a large Bull Pen that had been constructed on the forward end of the flight deck. All Hands then stood by for the arrival of His Majesty. At just about this moment some lowly Pollywogs who were loose on the ship managed to get to the controls of the deck edge elevator and set the machinery into motion causing the elevator to go down and caused considerable damage to the tank. It did not however, cause Trusty Shellbacks to falter, for they went to work and had the tank in operation by the time that His Majesty and His Court had arrived aboard. This was no small task and it pleased His Majesty when he learned about it. Within a few moments after the elevator dropped His Majesty was sighted and the Task Force laid too long enough to pick up the Royal Party. The Royal Party was met by the Executive Officer who, escorted His Majesty to the bridge where they and the Captain exchanged greetings and recalled former visits of the Captain into Neptune's Domain. His Majesty then returned to the flight deck Pollywogs were lined up in three ranks on where he set up his court and started hearing their knees, with their heads and hands on the the cases dealing first with some of the very

Some of these special cases included such people as the Navigator, the Gunnery Officer and Division Boatswain's Mates. With these and the "rebels" of the "E" Division he dealt most harshly. It was not long before King Neptune had everything going in full swing. There was an attempt during the proceedings by the Pollywogs to break out of the Bull Pen, but this was quickly stopped by prompt action on the part of the Kops.

By 1100 all the cases had been heard and there was not one Pollywog left aboard. His Majesty having completed his trying work returned the ship to the Captain with a wish for a happy and successful cruise. He then proceeded to the Weather Hawse Pipe where he made his departure from the ship. The Captain accepted the return of the ship and upon receiving it called all hands to turn-to and make her a fit ship for Shellbacks to live in.

The following copy of dispatch was received aboard from the Task Force Commander who had forwarded it to us from His Majesty, King Neptunus Rex.

FROM CTF-38 QUOTE

FOLLOWING RECEIVED FROM NEPTUNUS REX: "THE DISTURBED WATERS CAUSED BY TASK FORCE 38 HAS RESULTED IN NOTORI-OUS AND CHAOTIC CONDITIONS AMONG MY LOYAL SUBJECTS OF THE DEEP. IM-POSSIBLE TO MAINTAIN ORDER. DOWN, YOUR MIGHTY SHIPS ARE NOW SURROUNDED BY AN IMPENETRABLE AND IRRESISTIBLE CORDON. I APPRECIATE THE URGENCY OF YOUR MISSION BUT TRAN-QUILITY IN MY DOMAIN MUST BE OBTAINED. YOUR LOWLY CARGO OF LANDLUBBERS CANNOT BE GRANTED IMMUNITY UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES NOR CAN THEY BE PERMITTED TO LABOR UNDER FALSE IL-LUSION THAT THE STEEL SIDES OF YOUR SHIPS AND THEIR PONDEROUS NUMBERS WILL SAVE THEM FROM THEIR LOWLY DOOM. ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF THIS MES-SAGE IS DIRECTED." ALL SHIPS THIS FORCE WILL TAKE IMMEDIATE ACTION TO SUBDUE IRREVERENT CONDUCT AND ACTS ON THE PART OF ALL SCURVY POLLYWOGS. EACH SHIP ESTABLISH DIRECT COMMUNICATION WITH DAVEY JONES VIA THE ENGINE-ROOM TELEGRAPH. INSURE TRANQUILITY OF ROYAL DOMAIN. PREPARE POLLYWOGS FOR IMPENDING DOOM.

The following is the answer sent by Capt. Hamilton to His Majesty in answer to his above message:

FROM CAPT. HAMILTON, U.S.S. ANTIETAM QUOTE

CONCUR MOST HEARTILY, THIS WILL BE GREAT DAY FOR THE ANTIETAM IN THAT ALL THE LANDLUBBERS OF MY CREW WILL BE PRESENTED TO YOUR MAJESTY FOR SUCH JUST PUNISHMENT AS YOU IN YOUR JUSTICE MAY ADJUDGE. DEEPLY HONORED AGAIN TO HAVE THE PRIVILEGE OF MEET-ING YOUR MOST GRACIOUS MAJESTY AND ONLY REGRET THAT URGENCY OF MY MIS-SION PERMITS ONLY A SHORT STAY IN YOUR REALM. HAVE ABOARD ABOUT 1500 ENLISTED AND 150 OFFICER POLLYWOGS. ARRANGEMENTS ARE BEING COMPLETED TO DELIVER THEM TO YOUR MAJESTY FOR TRIAL. THOSE POLLYWOGS CHARGED WITH PARTICULARLY HEINOUS CRIMES WILL BE BROUGHT TO YOUR ATTENTION.

The following is a copy of a message received aboard from the Task Force Commander. It is quoted in full.

FROM CTF-38 TO TF-38


SENIOR SHELLBACK OF TASK FORCE 38 HAS RECEIVED BY SEAWEED COMMUNICATION CODE THAT DAVEY JONES, PEG LEG AND THE ROYAL SCRIBE ARE BEING DISPATCHED BY HIS GRACIOUS HIGHNESS NEPTUNUS REX VIA SEA HORSE SQUADRONS BOARD EACH VESSEL AND SERVE NOTICE ON ALL SLIMY POLLYWOGS TO BE PRE-PARED AT 0830 WEDNESDAY 7 MAY 1947 MINDS SOULS AND BODIES MAY BE STEELED TO APPEAR BEFORE THE ROYAL COURT TO THE ORDEAL THAT AWAITS THEM.

BE ADJUDGED THE DOOM THEY SO RICHLY BE PREPARED TO RECEIVE ON BOARD THE ROYAL EMISSARIES EVER THEY MAY ARRIVE ON TUESDAY 6 1947. POST ADEQUATE LOOKOUT MAY WATCH, DUE TIME SHOULD BE ALLOCATED TO INSTRUCTION OF ALL NOVICES WHO ARE APPROACHING THE DREADFUL MYS-TERIES OF THE DEEP IN ORDER THAT THEIR The following is a recording of the broadcast made by the Armed Forces Radio Service to the Pollywogs of Task Force 38:

QUOTE

"THE UNITED STATES FLEET TASK FORCE 38 WILL CROSS THE EQUATOR IN A FEW HOURS. MORE THAN SEVEN THOUSAND MEN ARE IN THIS FORCE, INCLUDING A

LARGE NUMBER OF POLLYWOGS, OTHER-WISE KNOWN AS PLOWJOCKEYS AND LANDLUBBERS. WE WISH THE POLLYWOGS GOOD LUCK. THE SHELLBACKS REPORT THAT THEY WILL NEED IT."

IMPORTANT

Sunday, 4 May 1947

1. Last night at 0000 a WAVE mermaid messenger hailed the ship and informed the Captain that Davey Jones, the Royal Scribe, accompanied by a party of Royal Personages, will come aboard the ANTIETAM some time Monday afternoon to deliver a communication from NEPTUNUS REX whose domain the ship will then be entering.

 The Royal Scribe will come aboard officially, that is, as a Personal Ambassador Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of His Majesty, Neptunus, Ruler of the Raging Main and Mystic Deeps, also Grand Mongol of the

Far East.

3. All hands must realize that this official visit will be a most solemn occasion. All are enjoined to help insure that the good name of

the ANTIETAM is in no way detracted from.

4. The Royal Scribe and his Party are expected at about 1500. However, the exact time of arrival or means by which they will travel is not known. He may come by plane, ship, submarine, amphibious jeep, Dolphin chariot or Sea Horse Punt. To the end, that the approach of the party will be duly detected and final arrangements be made on time, special Equator Details will be set at 1300.

5. The composition, duties and uniform of the Special Equator Details, First Group and the Special plan of the day for Monday after-

noon will be:

1300—The regular O.O.D. pass the word "Station the Special Equator Details, First Group."

NOTE: All these details shall be stationed on the forward end of the flight deck.

The Meeting of Davey Jones and Capt. W. H. Hamilton

The following dispatch was received from the Commander of Task Force 38. The dispatch is quoted in full.

QUOTE

The Royal Court Scribe (with Summons)


Bugler sounds attention followed by 1 blast, 2 blasts and 3 blasts.
